## Signature Project Recognition Program and Contest

### Criteria

By definition, a signature project is a service project, fundraiser or event that includes all of the following:

Takes place annually or is recurring

Enhances the Kiwanis brand

Demonstrates significant impact on the community in terms of funds raised or children served

Strengthens membership and partnership opportunities

### To qualify for the Signature Project Recognition Program and Contest, projects must meet the following criteria:

Meet the definition of a signature project

Be a service project, fundraiser or event

Benefit children

Follow proper brand guidelines and use the correct Kiwanis logo or other brand elements

### Special consideration will be given to projects that also:

Include at least one Kiwanis partner

Involve other civic partners or community stakeholders

See contest rules and submission instructions.

The deadline to enter is March 31, 2017.
